This lockdown has been more difficult for many of us especially as we realise we are coming up on being closed for worship for a whole calendar year. More difficult is the knowledge that there have been now over 100,000 deaths in our land; a terrible disturbing number of grieving heartbroken people mourning dear loved ones.

The Archbishops of York and Canterbury and the President and Vice President of our Methodist Conference have encouraged us to pause and pray and reflect every night at **6 p.m**. thinking of those affected by Covid 19 and the unprecedented level of grief and sorrow in our communities.

Can I offer this to you as an important way for us to minister to our local community, to pray as 'an expression of love', to stand with those so affected by the pandemic. Within our own number are those who have had the virus themselves and we all I am sure know of others too, each will testify to the awful effects of this pandemic.

I meet with a family in just two days time who have to organise a funeral for a loved one who died alone while her husband of over 60 years was in a separate ward unable to see his wife or anyone else; their sorrow and grief is unimaginable, yet is multiplied over 100,000 times across our nation.

I hope you will join me in prayer and reflection every night the rest of this month.

NEW TOWN FOODBANK SATELLITE

A joint venture between us, St. Stephen's and the Colchester Foodbank, run out of St. Stephen's has been running since September. The message is getting out there that we are open but with the current Lockdown and more people losing their jobs / being furloughed - demand is expected to rise.

Furthermore, with Moorside closing and the main Foodbank depot moving to Stanway, we (and Greenstead) expect to see more people coming to us from our side of town.

MAKE LUNCH

Christine and Edward continue to work really hard with the Make Lunch parcels and the recipients are really grateful for the help and care shown, especially over Christmas. In December we managed to secure two additional lots of grant funding and this together with another very generous donation and some money from TLG means that this project remains self-funding and in pretty good financial shape right now.

Having spoken to the Foodbank we are hopeful that they might also be able to assist us in the short term with some food stocks which would also be helpful.

Food parcels are now being delivered fortnightly as opposed to weekly, but with larger amounts, which provide the equivalent of **930 meals delivered to 16 families.**

These are excellent pieces of outreach work and help us, the Church, to share God's love in a really practical way into the local community.
