Dear Friends,

Can I thank everyone who has supported us in prayer and other ways this year when such a long debilitating abdominal illness has made life so very difficult.

The hospital took small intestine biopsies in November and we pray these are clear just like the earlier large intestine biopsies were, though I cannot speak to the consultant until early January. His previous diagnosis of Pancreatic Enzyme Insufficiency is being treated but the correct dose of meds has not yet been found.

I am very disappointed that I remain too unwell to return to work. It really has been very difficult to wait so long for help to come. We had hoped so much that treatment would have been found before now so that I could return to my calling before Christmas. We pray that in January the enzyme insufficiency can be treated properly and some emergency meds found to treat symptoms if and when they come back.

I am sorry to have missed so much life and ministry and God willing will be back in January.

May God bless us all with a healthy and safe Christmas and New Year.

For those unable to access YouTube, DVDs of the service will be available beforehand. Please speak to a Steward if you would like a copy of the DVD.

Just to highlight a small change to our services - there will now be two offertory plates placed just inside the doors at the back of the church. These will be brought to the front for blessing during the service, so we would encourage the congregation to put their offering in the plate beforehand.

Also a reminder that the post boxes for Christmas cards will **not** be in the vestibule this year due to Covid restrictions.

Please continue to pray for Margaret Clubb and her family, our minister Joe and Dave and all those who are facing challenging times.

ADVENT

We're pitched into Advent. I've been seeing notices announcing Christmas parties, Christmas illuminations, Christmas shopping expeditions and the like since August!

The advertisers and the world of commerce have 'bought out' Christmas in a big way. So it's very hard to conjure up the season that leads up to Christmas, that Advent season I mentioned a moment ago, with any sense of realism. We've had a five month approach to Christmas, why on earth do we need a five week season now? I'll tell you why.

Christmas is an explosion of joy. A meaningless universe has been penetrated by a shaft of light which, with sudden clarity, puts things into perspective and gives us a reason for being on this planet.

That incursion of common sense and good news is to be prepared for in order to be appreciated. We need one step at a time, to peer into the darkness, fumbling our way forward as best we can, taking the advice of the prophets and sages of old.

And we need to become aware that, at the heart of an otherwise meaningless universe, there is a guiding principle that draws us forward relentlessly.

When that guiding principle, that eternal word, is declared in a flesh-and-blood way, when an otherwise abstract notion wears a human face, when something we catch *tantalising* glimpses of (but not more) turns out to be a person with a name, then we can shout 'Hallelujah'.

Then, we can join the angelic chorus in their eternal hymn, 'Gloria in Excelcis Deo'. Then we can raise our hosannas and delight in this new manifestation of the glory and goodness of God.

That's why we need Advent. That's why this five week period simply must displace the five month tattiness that we've had to work through, like swimming through treacle. It's the meaning of life we're talking about. And we Christians can have cause for joy. But we'll want to share our joy with the whole wide world.
