Just before Christmas I shared with the people at St. Leonard's on Hythe Hill - it was so cold! The church has no facilities or heating. It was closed in 1982. It is an ancient 13th Century building that was extended in the 15th Century. It's impressive and quite sad really. It was great to see so many people there wanting to have a Carol Service as they always have. It's kept going by Friends of St. Leonard's and the Churches Conservation Trust.

I shared with them this simple message about what I thought the most important message of Christmas is, saying that everything is all summed up in one word, 'love'.

Christmas and Christian's are all about love - always love.

Gods desire was always love, raising Israel up to be a light for the nations, with a covenant of peace and love. They like all of us hungered after other words.

Self serving
Greedy
Power grabbing
and hungry for more and more

They liked being the 'in crowd' especially if that meant others were kept out.

They excluded people because of their origins or disability or sexuality or ethnicity.

God said love but that's seemed too easy too simple too inclusive.

'We don't want everyone in if we don't like them' people said.

Human beings everywhere since the dawn of time have liked difference and saying who's in and out.

Yet God's responding cry at Christmas was love for all for ever.

Human beings still these last 2000 years protest the inclusive all enfolding message of Christmas and prefer select groups and love saying still you can come in if

If you do this, aren't like that,

If you don't make us feel uncomfortable,

If you dress right and don't change anything,

or say anything difficult

and definitely if you aren't - then God forbid.

Love for our tribe but not theirs.

You can come in but . . . women must know their place, children must be seen and not heard, LGBTQ+ people need to be quiet and not seen or lead. We still do it.

God said love. Just love. No conditions or exceptions.

Anything else is out of step with the Christmas message of lowly shepherds and other faiths wise men validating Jesus holy calling.

This New Year let's make sure we are following God's agenda and mission and standing for love, acceptance and inclusion.

If anyone ever tells you anything else is more important than that I'm certain they are not speaking for our God who said,

John 3:16-17 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him'.
