Dear Friends.

As I write this my family and I are preparing for our big move to Colchester! Boxes are accumulating, stuff is everywhere and in the midst of it all, I am trying to complete my MA dissertation which is due in August. It is all very chaotic as you might imagine, but beneath all the 'mess' there is a real buzz and excitement. We are all so very excited to be joining you in Colchester! Transitions are exciting as well as daunting. I feel joyful to be stationed as a probationer minister to the Colchester Circuit but at the same time, I must confess that I do have my anxieties, simply because I have never done this before.

You must feel you are in some transition too as you welcome a newbie probationer minister and her family to your circuit. However, Chris has assured me over and over again that it will all be fine because we are in this together. So, I rest assured in her words and God of course that we are in this together. I so much look forward to journeying alongside you, getting to know you, listening to your stories and learning from you.

So, a little bit about myself. In fact, my life has revolved around transitions and changes. I was born in Seoul, South Korea and came to live in the UK with my family when I was 5 years old. Since then, I have had my share of moving around, moving schools, homes and country of residence. Much of it had to do with my father being a minister and a missionary at one stage. Before exploring my sense of call to presbyteral ministry, I studied ceramics at university and then spent some years working with and supporting adults and children with special needs in schools and homes. I had hoped to explore art therapy with this experience but landed on a Theology and Counselling course which felt

right at the time. The course ignited a desire to study Theology further, become a preacher then delve into ministry.

I met my husband, Yoon in a Korean Church in Ealing. When I moved to San Francisco (a story for another time) to study Theology, Yoon asked me out over the phone. We dated long-distance for about a year, got married in a Methodist Church in Redbridge, Essex (Essex was my home for several years), and lived in Turkey whilst Yoon worked on a research project on Black Holes (please ask him about this and not me!). He is now a secondary school Maths teacher. We have three children, Reyna our eldest and Laelle and Naythan who are twins. They do keep us on our toes!

I enjoy Theology, pottering around in the garden, visiting garden centres and art galleries. As a family, we love exploring historical places in Britain, especially cathedrals, quaint villages and seaside towns. Colchester is next on our list. I really look forward to witnessing the ways God will bring us together in all our uniqueness and differences, make use of all our diverse gifts and work within and through us. I pray that together we may catch glimpses of God's marvellous love for all God's people and that we may grow, flourish and be encouraged in our faith journey together.

LETTER FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Friends,

The best laid plans... Sometimes, however well something is thought through, something changes at the last minute and things don't happen. The train is delayed, roadworks hold us up, the flight for going on holiday gets cancelled or any number of things can get in the way. The anticipation that was felt gets somewhat reduced when things need to be altered.

As we enter a new Methodist year, many plans have been made. Some activities which took a summer break now start up again and new ideas, which were brought forward, begin to come together. For some of the churches in the Circuit and for Hannah, it is a time of new beginnings and the plans that have been put into place to support her and the churches begin to come to fruition.

When plans come together there can be a good feeling, but when things have to be changed, especially at the last minute, a real sense of disappointment. Our emotions can then affect the way we respond to things. We know that we are assured of Jesus' presence with us in all that we face, whether it is good or difficult. And we must look ahead to the hope of all that we are promised with faith.

Whether plans have worked or been changed, we should continue to walk on together in, and with, faith. God's plans are bigger than ours, but each small plan in the meantime becomes part of the whole. As we enter a new season, we do so with faith and in the hope of Christ for today and for eternity.
