Dear Friends,

What do you do when you are roughly 200 miles from home and your car's engine warning light comes on? Would you panic? Yoon and I certainly did. My family came to join me in Telford for the ordination service, and as they arrived, the engine warning light came on. We've had problems with the engine in the past, so we naturally became worried. If it had been close to home, we might not have panicked as much, but being so far from home got us into a bit of a frenzy, and our stress levels went up.

When we are far from home and something unexpected happens, knocking us off balance, it may unsettle us. Warning lights inside us may flash, indicating that something is wrong and that the heart of the issue needs to be addressed.

I spent some time before ordination at Cliff College for an ordinand's retreat. One of the sessions was about being in the Word. When we are far from the Word, we are far from God, and I sense that is similar to being far from home and feeling anxious when unexpected hiccups come our way. It is God's Word that roots, nourishes, nurtures, navigates and feeds us. If we are far from it, we could find that we lose our bearings and sense of peace within.

Let me ask you a strange question. When did you last brush your teeth? I imagine sometime within the last 24 hours at least. We need to brush our teeth at least twice daily to maintain good dental health and hygiene.

Now, let me ask you, how often do you read your Bible? It is a harder question to answer. I know this because *I* find reading the Bible more of a challenge than brushing my teeth.

So, let me ask us (me included) a few questions to get us thinking. What does being in the Word mean to you? When did you last find yourself feeling enriched by God's Word? When you feel distant from God's Word, do you feel distant from God? What warning signs might you recognise in yourself when you feel far from God? What might you do to draw nearer to God's Word?

Summer is finally upon us, and it is usually a time when there might be a 'lull' in church activities (if there ever is such a time). I hope you can spend this time resting, recharging, connecting with the people you love and also reconnecting with yourself and with God through God's Word.

It is through the Word of God that we can sustain ourselves, find nourishment for life's journeys and walk together with others. The Word of God, which pierces our souls, can help recognise those 'warning lights' in our inmost beings and give us the strength and wisdom to face and address them.

For 'the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of the soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.' (Heb. 4:12)
